- Travel west along the 401 towards Kingston/Toronto
- Take the first exit 698 into Brockville (North Augusta Road exit)
- Turn left at the end of the ramp (you are facing a box store).
- Travel to the first set of lights and turn left onto North Augusta Road(over the 401) and continue to King Street (T-intersection)
- Turn right on King Street and follow King Street into the downtown commercial area of Brockville.
- Picket Fence Fabrics is one block past Courthouse Avenue on the left (south)
- You have arrived. Welcome!
